Mission and Service - Lorna Hanson

"and you will be My witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea, and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Acts 1: 8b

These were the last words spoken by our Lord Jesus before He left this earth and was taken up to heaven. Is there any significance for us AB women to the names He mentioned – Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and the ends of the earth?

First, Jerusalem. Jerusalem is a city, the very city where our Lord was crucified. Each of us lives in a town or city. In what ministries do you get involved in your own location? Does your church have a food pantry, a clothes closet, or a jail ministry? Is there an organization in town that ministers to the homeless or the trafficked women where you could volunteer?

Second, Judea. Judea was a group of cities, like the state of Maine. What ministries in our own state do we see a need that we can support? Periodically, ABWM of Maine has adopted a project to support the Baptist camps in our state. There are three – Baptist Park, Baptist Youth Camp, and China Lake Camp. All have a vital ministry to children and youth in these troublesome times. Is a camp in your area supported by your church?

Third, Samaria. Samaria can be likened to the country in which we live – USA. Throughout many highly populated regions in the United States there are ministries to new immigrants, ministries that feed the hungry and support the poor, provide after school programs to enrich education, and ministries to race track workers. When we collect clothing, school supplies, and household goods to take to the Multicultural Center in Lowell and Lexington, Massachusetts, we are ministering to Samaria.

Fourth, ends of the earth. ABWMaine has done so well with this one. We love our missionaries and we love to send them financial support or meet other needs in a tangible way. Your group of women or church might look at the project list for a missionary special to you and commit to getting involved in that project. For example, a lady in the Auburn church sent her trombone to Congo to enhance their praise band. Recently, women decided to buy goats for African women who needed a source of income.

As American Baptist Women, missions have been a big part of who we are and what we support. There was a time when our national ABWM worked hand in hand with the American Baptist Home Mission Society and International Ministries. White Cross and support of our home and foreign missionaries were on the forefront. We no longer receive quotas from national, but the needs are still present. As we consider carrying out these last words of our Lord, how do we apply His commands and how do we stay supportive and involved?
