#### Secretaries Report - August 11 Board Meeting- Martha Walker

The meeting opened with prayer by Doris. Those in attendance were: Doris, Stacey, Linda, Judy, Sandy, Dina, and Martha. The other officers were involved in the registration process, at this time.

Doris also led devotions based on Psalms 101:1-2 and Psalms 149:1. What makes your heart sing? To sing yourself, to listen to others sing, to listen to birds sing, to experience physical healing, your morning devotions, to see the sunrise or a sunset, or be in the company of another Christian?

Linda asked for prayer for her sister Lisa. Her best friend had just died, and Lisa asked Linda, "Does God hate me?" We prayed.

Reports were given by each coordinator, starting with Dina. Mission work in Maine is still affectionately known as White Cross. There are three levels.

International Ministries support is cash only. Mailing costs are prohibitive and there is no guarantee merchandise will actually arrive. The ABC-USA website has a list of all Global Servants and their financial needs. All purchases are made in the country.

American Baptist Home Mission Societies handles National Ministries, that is all ministries in the United States and Puerto Rico. Again, the website lists all ministries and contact information. Each local ABW group is encouraged to choose the ministry nearest them to support with goods and cash. This is known as Operation Planting Hope. The nearest missions to us are Massachusetts Baptist Multicultural Ministries and Teens Alive at Calvary Baptist Church. MBMM was out state project this year. We have received a much appreciated thank you from them.

State Missions is just that, Christian ministries in your state. Strictly American Baptist in Maine are the three summer camps: Baptist Park in Mapleton, Christian Youth Camp in Charlotte and China Lake Camp. These camps will receive the money from the silent auction, basket auction and jewelry sales.

Other ministries in Maine are your local food and clothing cupboards, schools, immigrant ministries, pregnancy resource centers, Sarah's House in Holden, and the Ronald McDonald House. Those trafficked in Maine remains confidential. Contact is made through the state hot-line.

Marge reported Judy has the Summer Conference ready to go. She also reported that our past president Wandah remains very ill and has plans to go to Boston soon. Her husband plans to bring her to conference for the day on Friday. Her husband has recently been diagnosed with kidney cancer. They both need our prayers.

Treasurer, Stacey reported she is still learning. She expressed a frustration with the ABC Extension and the Foundation. Even having received formal notice, that at the annual convention, Stacey Emery had been elected Treasurer and Sandra Rhoda, Assistant Treasurer, they continue to send interest payment to past treasurers.

Educational Gifts Coordinator Judy Ledger reported three applications had been requested. Theresa Savage never replied. Olivia Washburn submitted her application. She has become ill and withdrew. The third applicant, Cara Jurczak, has received our gift the past two years. She will be a senior at New Brunswick Bible Institute. She remains an A student. She is also spending her summer with campers at China Lake. The vote was unanimous to award Cara the gift of \$1,000.

Also discussed was the need to advertise ourselves. Possible suggestions were: press releases and Christian radio.

Treasurer, Stacey presented a written report. After paying all our bills and expenses as of August 2, 2022. We have \$15,789 in out TD checking account and invested funds in the American Baptist Extension \$5,000 and American Baptist Foundation Educational Gifts \$20,000.

Martha turned in a bill for the publication of the directories and trifolds for \$330.

It was voted to give all proceeds from the auction, basket auction and jewelry sales to out three camps. This vote was unanimous.

Doris read the letter she prepared and had read at Bea Violette's funeral. She was unable to attend.

Doris reported that she has been advised that the American Baptist Women of Maine have been remembered in the will of Bea Violette. It will take time to settle her estate, but the best estimate is we will receive around \$20,000.

It was voted to continue Zoom Meetings.

The next board meeting will be October 15, 2022, at the home of Martha Walker, in Anson.

The March meeting is on the 25<sup>th</sup>, 2023, in East Millinocket.

The meeting adjourned with prayer and following lunch prepared by China Lake, then everyone attended Summer Conference.

#### Secretaries Report – Annual Business Meeting- Martha Walker

The meeting was called to order

by President Doris Sherman. Fifty-plus women were in attendance, from across Maine.

White Cross Coordinator, Dina Richards, Read the Thank You letter from the Massachusetts Baptist Multicultural Center. They were our state project. Not only gifts of money but also large quantities of gently used and new household goods and clothing of all sizes, for a large number of new immigrants. Our churches filled their storeroom.

We have been advised by the national to continue with the association and state reports; however, to keep all these records in Maine. A much simpler record sheet has been created. The intent is that each lady, in the local women's group, would have a copy. She can then record her gifts of money, purchased goods, and the lovingly handcrafted items she has made, throughout the year. At the end of the year, each church can combine these into a church report, which is sent to the White Cross Association Chairman. Association Reports are then combined into a state report. This report is then kept in ABWM's state records. Hopefully, individual record-keeping will make the process easier and not rely on memory, at the end of the year.

Missions and Service Coordinator, Lorna, put the letter and update of all our special Global Servants into each attendee "Goody bag" to be enjoyed later.

Personal Development Coordinator, Marg Muise, gave a special thank you to Judy Ledger for all the work she has done to make this a special Summer Conference. And to all the ladies who attended. The most in recent years.

Church and Community Coordinator Wandah encourages each lady to continue spreading the love of God not only in her church but where she can serve, in her own community.

Treasurer, Stacey, referred each lady to the written report, included in their "Goody Bag".

Highlights are \$15,789 in our TD Checking Account. We have \$5,000 in the American Baptist Extension Corporation. This is a bequest, from a former member's will, years ago. The interest earned is returned to us. We have \$20,000 in the American Baptist Foundation, designated Educational Gifts. The interest earned is returned to us and given to a student or students studying for the ministry.

Educational Gifts Coordinator, Judy, reported three applications had been requested. One lady has become ill, and her education plans are on "hold". The second application was never returned.

The third application was from Cara Jurczak. We all know her, as she has received our gift for the past two years. She is very active in the summer camp program at China Lake. She is a New Brunswick Bible Institute senior and has earned an "A" average. The vote was unanimous.

It was voted that all proceeds from this year's silent auction and basket sales would be equally divided between our three camps. The vote was unanimous. Sisters, Sandy Rhoda, and Jan Rockwell donated all the proceeds from the sale of their mother's jewelry to the camps.

It was proposed to purchase three, automated external defibrillators. Also known as AED's. One for each of our three camps. Estimated cost is \$1,000 each. This piece of medical equipment is capable of saving a life, in an emergency. It was suggested, to use donated funds, to purchase these. A letter would be sent to every family who had donated this money, telling them how the money was used. The vote was unanimous.

It was announced that Zoom Meetings would continue, starting in October. The date to be announced and to request an invitation, prior to the meeting, contact Wandah or Stacey. Previous attendees will be sent an invitation to join, a few days prior to the date.

However, having them close at hand helped us to know them and their journey even better. Greetings to my Sisters in Christ; We had a lovely time at our ABWM of Maine Summer Conference this past August. We were very pampered by everyone at China Lake Camp. The friendship, food, and accommodations were simply lovely!

Ladies at the conference were so gracious with their donations of items for the silent auction, gift baskets, and jewelry sale. We raised a total of \$1,679 for our State Project missions through the sale. In addition, President Doris Sherman's rummage and bake sale at Oakfield Baptist Church raised an additional \$1,514. We also collected an additional \$480 through the summer conference envelopes. The grand total for this summer's State Project has allowed us to send each of our designated camps \$1,224! This includes China Lake, Mapleton Baptist Park, and Baptist Youth Camp.

Our total donations collected in this summer's conference envelopes totaled \$2,270! In addition, the love offering taken up during the conference totaled \$2,265 for the Clammers and \$2,195 for the Hansens.

It is evident our ladies adhere to this Bible verse with complete sincerity and commitment!
