Mission & Service Lorna Hanson

The Pandemic has really impacted our lives for almost two years. Churches, schools, restaurants, etc. have closed, reopened, and closed again. Epic numbers have been hospitalized and many have died. These are definitely difficult times. Yet, our missionaries continue to "remain on the field", dedicated to their call, and serve passionately in their ministries shared with people in places such as Lebanon, the Caribbean, and Congo.

Sarah and Dan Chetti have remained in Lebanon and serve in the volatile Middle East. Sarah's ministry is with Insaaf that serves among one of the most vulnerable populations in Lebanese society: migrant workers from Asia and Africa. They have no worker rights and are often considered "strangers" in Lebanon. Not only is there a huge economic crisis in Lebanon, but there are also hungry and sick among their population of citizens and refugees.

Insaaf helps repatriate women back to their home country.

Insaaf provides medical care for migrant domestic workers.

Insaaf assists in providing hard to find affordable medicine and treatment

Insaaf distributes monthly vouchers and food parcels as well as sets up medical appointments for the migrant workers

Ketly and Vital Pierre have been based in Massachusetts during most of the pandemic so Ketly could receive treatment for cancer. They have remained active virtually in order to share updates of their ministries with Haitians in the Dominican Republic. Recently Ketly received wonderful news. She is cancer free!

Do you receive Ann Clemmer's frequent posts on Facebook? If so, you may search the trombone section to find a woman playing her trombone. Donna Sweetser from Auburn, looked forward to these posts and suddenly one day thought, "I wonder if they could use my 70-year-old trombone in the Heal Africa Praise Team." She asked me, I asked Ann, and the answer was "yes". In late December, when the Clemmer's returned to Goma, DRC, the trombone and slide oil were among the items they packed. In the meantime, a Congolese woman expressed interest in joining the Praise Team, but she didn't have an instrument. However, she knew how to play the trombone. Image Donna's excitement to know that the trombone that was no longer useful to her was now in the hands of someone who wanted to praise God. And halfway around the world!
